


Make the Economy Matter! Digital Quizzes from the Atlanta Fed

Have your students ever wondered which states produce the most turkeys, sweet potatoes, and pumpkins for Thanksgiving feasts? As digital natives, maybe they want to know what Cyber Monday sales were in 2015 versus 2005. As many of your students are looking forward to their pending adulthood, are they curious to learn what percentage of 30-year-olds were living on their own in 2015 versus 1975? While most students can't imagine that they will ever retire, how many could name the state, after Florida, with the highest share of people age 65? It will probably surprise them and you as well.

Students match currency with an interesting fact associated with it.



Students answer questions about the Sixth District.



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
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Students answer true or false questions about the Federal Reserve System.

Students arrange notable events from Fed history from earliest to latest.




Students test their knowledge of Thanksgiving trivia.
